These notices shall satisfy two separate but related procedural requirements for activities to be undertaken by the CITY OF MOORPARK.

REQUEST FOR RELEASE OF FUNDS

On or about June 21, 2024 the City of Moorpark will submit a request to HUD for the release of Economic Development Initiatives (EDIs) Community Project Funding/Congressionally Directed Spending funds under Division L – Transportation, Housing and Urban Development, and Related Agencies Appropriations Act, 2023 as amended, to undertake a project known as Moorpark City Library for the purpose of Construction of a New Moorpark City Library and associated amenities. The estimated project funding is \$30,000,000 and will be located at 83 W. High Street, Moorpark, CA 93021.

FINDING OF NO SIGNIFICANT IMPACT

The City of Moorpark has determined that the project will have no significant impact on the human environment. Therefore, an Environmental Impact Statement under the National Environmental Policy Act of 1969 (NEPA) is not required. Additional project information is contained in the Environmental Review Record (ERR) on file at City of Moorpark, 799 Moorpark Avenue, Moorpark, CA 93021, Moorpark City Library, 699 Moorpark Avenue, Moorpark, CA 93021 and may be examined or copied weekdays 9 A.M to 5 P.M. PUBLIC COMMENTS

Any individual, group, or agency may submit written comments on the ERR to the City of Moorpark at library@moorparkca.gov. All comments received by June 21, 2024 will be considered by the City of Moorpark prior to authorizing submission of a request for release of funds. Comments should specify which Notice they are addressing.

ENVIRONMENTAL CERTIFICATION

The City of Moorpark certifies to HUD that Douglas Spondello in their capacity as Community Development Director consents to accept the jurisdiction of the Federal Courts if an action is brought to enforce responsibilities in relation to the environmental review process and that these responsibilities have been satisfied. HUD's approval of the certification satisfies its responsibilities under NEPA and related laws and authorities and allows the City of Moorpark to use Program funds.

OBJECTIONS TO RELEASE OF FUNDS

HUD will accept objections to its release of fund and the City of Moorpark's certification for a period of fifteen days following the anticipated submission date or its actual receipt of the request (whichever is later) only if they are on one of the following bases: (a) the certification was not executed by the Certifying Officer of the City of Moorpark; (b) the City of Moorpark has omitted a step or failed to make a decision or finding required by HUD regulations at 24 CFR part 58; (c) the grant recipient or other participants in the development process have committed funds, incurred costs or undertaken activities not authorized by 24 CFR Part 58 before approval of a release of funds by HUD; or (d) another Federal agency acting pursuant to 40 CFR Part 1504 has submitted a written finding that the project is unsatisfactory from the standpoint of environmental quality. Objections must be prepared and submitted in accordance with the required procedures (24 CFR Part 58, Sec. 58.76) and shall be addressed via (1) physical address to the HUD Office of Community Planning and Development, Los Angeles Field Office, 300 N. Los Angeles St., Ste. 4054 Los Angeles, CA 90012 or (2) email the HUD Los Angeles Office of Community Planning and Development at CPDLA@hud.gov. Potential objectors should contact the HUD Los Angeles Office of Community Planning and Development via email at CPDLA@hud.gov to verify the actual last day of the objection period.
